Two years ago I was approached by Joris Benninga with the idea to create sustainable cities for refugees in the regions of origin with the help of refugee talents currently present in Western Europe. I thought the idea excellent and revolutionary. I decided to join him and together we founded GreenfieldCities. One year ago I was at the Future Force Conference chaired by former Chief of Defence Tom Middendorp. In his key-note address he stated that the migration crisis and climate change are the biggest (security) threats for NATO and the EU. And that climate change is fueling the migration crisis. GreenfieldCities addresses both threats. It enormously strengthened my belief we were on the right track. Right now, a team of 10 people from Syria, Eritrea and Sweden are busy elaborating on a sustainable campus in Jordan. A campus to learn, live and work for 1.500 Syrians and Jordanians. Very well received in Jordan and in the Netherlands. That's not revolutionary anymore, at most ground breaking.

This is in a nutshell the history of GreenfieldCities from a personal perspective. In this newsletter we dwell a bit more upon the factual milestones. The next issue will focus on GreenfieldCities news happening right now.
